

TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA STANDING REGULATIONS FOR RALLYSPRINT

PREAMBLE

Dual Release Sprint

A speed event on a sealed surface, usually conducted on a permanent circuit, on which each vehicle is subject to individual release from the start. A vehicle may be permitted to start at a suitable interval following the previous vehicle, under conditions noted on the Track Licence. Overtaking is not permitted.

The replacement vehicle must have been scrutineered, and preferably be in the same class and type as the original vehicle. Where the original vehicle has recorded a time and the scrutineered replacement is not in the same class and type as the original vehicle, the replacement vehicle will not be eligible for prizes and/or trophies

3.11 Motorsport Australia Licence

Drivers must hold a minimum of a MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA Level 2S licence A single event licence Level 2SE will have to be organised by driver prior to event *Juniors*

Drivers must hold a MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA Level 2SJ – Ages 14 years and up to and including 17 years

7. COMPETITION

7.1 Qualifying

There will be a one practice/qualifying run, from Timing Loop A to Timing Loop B The running order for the heats will be the fastest to the slowest from qualifying times

7.2 Heats

The competition will consist of minimum 4 heats

Automobiles from different categories and type, will run separately in the heats.

After each timed heat has been run, drivers' times, (fastest to slowest) including penalties will be recorded. The fastest time of the day will determine placings on the day. The winner will be the driver with fastest time of the day recorded. **Drivers do NOT have to compete over BOTH DAYS to qualify as a winner, either overall or in their Class.**

Should drivers have equal points at the end of the heats the higher place will be awarded to the driver who has the fastest time in the last heat of the day, in Competition

7.3 Paddock and Marshalling Area

Speed in paddock shall not exceed 10 kph, failure to comply with this limit, if reported to the Stewards, may result in a penalty being applied.

7.4 Grid

No work may be carried out on automobiles on the grid, except on the grounds of safety, and only with the approval of the Chief Scrutineer.

7.5 Start Procedure

Starting Orders

Each driver and automobile is considered to have come under "Starter's Orders" on arrival at the start grid. Having come under starter's orders, such driver and automobile shall be considered to have started. Failure to proceed to the allocated start line on the grid when directed to do so may involve forfeiture of the run.





Starting Procedure

Automobiles will start two at a time for Rallycross 1 and four at a time for Rallycross 2 from a standing start, with engines running. The minimum requirement after the starter is satisfied that all is in order shall be:

- > 10 seconds prior to lights, display a 10 second board
- > 5 seconds prior to starting lights being illuminated: White light with No 5 will be shown
- O seconds red lights go on: after red lights illuminated, they shall be extinguished between 2- 5 seconds later <u>Indicating Start</u>

Procedure as above until all cars have left the grid

Jumping the Start

A driver starting when red lights are illuminated, or before the start flag is raised, shall be penalised 30 seconds, which is added to the driver's time for the event

The stewards shall have the power to increase any specified penalty and/or to apply other penalties.

7.6 Finish Procedure

Display Number 3 = 3 Laps to go Display Number 2 = 2 Laps to go Display LL = Last Lap Chequered Flag Flashing = End of Session – return to pits

7.7 Incidents on Track

7.8 Stopping the Race.

Should it be necessary to stop a race because the track is blocked by an accident, or because weather or other conditions make it dangerous to continue, the Clerk of Course shall order the red Flag or Lights to be displayed at each flag/light position. When the signal is given, each automobile shall immediately reduce speed and not overtake another competing automobile, in the knowledge that:

Results shall be the order as at the start of the lap before the lap in which the red flag is shown; Competing automobiles and service automobiles may be on the track;

The track may be totally blocked because of an accident

Weather conditions may have made the track undriveable at competition speed Drivers are to proceed at significantly reduced speed around the track to return to the paddock And follow the instruction of marshals whilst waiting on a decision of a re-run

7.9 Re-Runs

A re-run will be permitted:

If the timing apparatus fails;

If a red light has been shown in a competition and the Clerk of Course and/or Stewards determine to have a re-run;

In other circumstances as may be granted at the discretion of the Clerk of Course and/or Stewards

Any warnings or penalties applied in the original run will apply for the re-run.





7.10 Timing

Timing will:

- Be carried out to an accuracy of 0.1 second;
- Commence concurrently for all automobiles in an event
- AMBTransX2 Decoder system will be used as official timing My Laps software incorporating AMB Transponder Loop system
- Transponders will be in the upright position utilising a transponder bracket (\$30 one of purchase) within maximum distance off the road as per transponder specifications – Refer to Scrutineer
- Timing equipment in use for Race Meetings will be the only official times for Results No third party equipment will be recognised to determine results.

Should the transponder fail on a vehicle whilst competing the Driver will be given notice by the Grid Marshall to change the transponder. After transponder change the Driver will be given notification as to when and how his transponder will be checked to ensure the new transponder is registering on the timing system.

Entries who have two Drivers are to have their allocated transponder in the vehicle when competing.






7.12 Flag/Lights Signals As per MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA RSR



Red: An indication to a driver of stopping the race or practice session. Slow down and stay in single file – return to grid or pit lane as directed.

Yellow: An indication to a driver of danger ahead – slow-down (no overtaking) and be prepared to take avoiding action




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		Blue : Practice Session – a warning to a driver who is about to be overtaken.
		Race – a warning to a driver who is about to be lapped.

Green: An indication to a driver of the end of caution sector and all clear ahead. Drivers may resume racing.







Black/white checked: Finishing Flag displayed at the end of race or practice session – cease racing and return to pits or paddock.

7.13 Awards





1st in Class will be awarded to the fastest time posted over the two-day period. The Fastest Time of the Day will be awarded to the fastest time posted overall over the two-day period.
